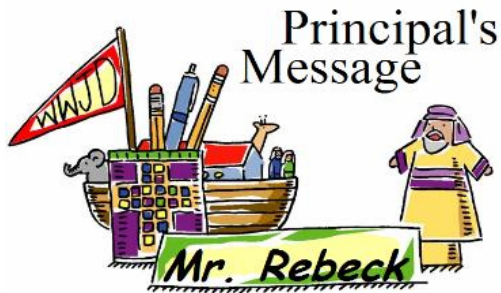

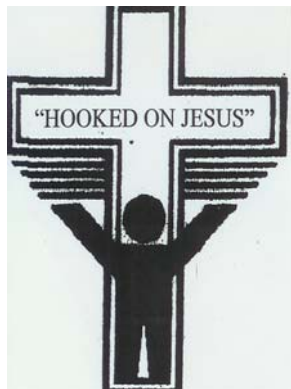

SCIENCE FAIR

Students are all preparing for our upcoming Science Fair. This fair will be held during our Lutheran Schools' Week from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. on March 11th.

Basically, Kindergarten through grade 3 will be asked to prepare a science demonstration, collection, or model of some area of science. Grades 4-8 will each plan, document, carry out, and display an experiment following the **SCIENTIFIC METHOD**. A written report as well as a display will be required.

The project proposal sheet (last one in the packet) is due FROM ALL STUDENTS by Tuesday, January 19th. These projects will be a very important part of the third quarter science grade.

We will be looking for volunteers from the congregation who would be willing to serve as science fair judges during the day of March 11th. If you are interested in giving a few hours looking over the projects (using a checklist scoring sheet), please let Mr. Rebeck know....we need several people to accomplish this.

The accreditation process helps us to see what we do well and what needs to be done to improve. In the end, this helps us make Zion Lutheran School be as effective and committed to growth and improvement.

Over the next month or two, we will be asking for volunteers to serve on these subcommittees (building facilities, student services, school's relationship with the community and church, personnel, finances, curriculum, to mention a few). If asked, this will require volunteers to meet with their subcommittee 3-4 times during the year to work through the self-evaluation. In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.
